GUEST ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

Welcome to Valleyfair!

We are glad you are here! At Valleyfair we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our Guests with a safe environment and we want our Guests to have a safe and enjoyable day. We are continually striving to improve our facilities.

Many amusement park rides incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the ride. Guests of larger or smaller size, Guests who have a history of heart, back or neck trouble, Guests who are pregnant, Guests who have had recent surgery, or Guests with casts, braces, restrictive devices or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for the safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

The Attraction Accessibility Program has been developed using our past experiences and our evaluation of each ride in both normal and emergency operating conditions. We also work closely with the manufacturer of each ride and our policies incorporate the manufacturers' guidelines as well as the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. We hope that this Guide will help Guests make the best choices to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience at the park. Our goal is to safely and efficiently accommodate the needs of all Guests, including individuals with disabilities.

Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of a ride without risk of injury to that person or other riders. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at Guest Services. If you feel that you or a member of your party may be affected by this policy, you are encouraged to visit Guest Services to obtain a list of rides you can safely ride. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our Associate to help accommodate you.

PLEASE RIDE SAFELY

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to a ride to anyone who we feel may not be able to safely experience the ride or may be a hazard to other Riders.

A Safety Guide sign is posted at every ride entrance and Alternate Access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the ride. Please review these signs prior to accessing the ride and ensure to follow all instructions provided.

In general, all Guests should be in good health and free from any conditions, known or unknown, that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Guest Services. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or if you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **do not ride.**

Generally, Guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in the seat and support their head and neck during the ride movements. Guests using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or be assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a Guest, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park safety policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **For your safety, do not enter an unauthorized area for any reason.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.






Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each ride. In general:

- Follow all proper rider positioning until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts, must be positioned, fastened, and tightened at all times.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals, jewelry, and other loose items are not permitted on most rides. Glasses must be secured. Smaller items may be secured in cargo pockets or waist packs as long as they do not interfere with the restraint system. In addition, smaller items may be left in a locker or with a non-Rider. Valleryfair is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- Due to the nature of our rides, picture taking, cell phone or electronic usage while riding is prohibited with the exception of Ferris Wheel, Carousel, Minnesota River Valley Railroad, PEANUTS™ Road Rally, and Antique Autos (driver excluded).
- Keep all parts of your body inside the ride unit at all times.
- Appropriate clothing and shoes are required for most rides. Valleryfair reserves the right to determine the appropriateness of riding attire.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in Valleryfair.

RIDE RATING SYSTEM




A Ride Rating System has been designed that provides a scale for rating the thrill factor of each ride. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park Guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

Each ride/attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides 	Rides that are generally calm and gentle in nature.
Mild Thrill Rides 	Rides that generally have low speeds with gentle motion and braking. Rides have smooth transitions with some changes in elevation and speed.
Moderate Thrill Rides 	Rides that generally have low to medium speeds and/or heights with moderate motion and braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in direction and/or speed during portions of the ride.
High Thrill Rides 	Rides that generally have medium to high speeds and/or heights with moderate to rapid braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in speed, direction, and/or elevation.
Aggressive Thrill Rides 	Rides that generally have one or more of the following: high speeds and/or heights, aggressive and unexpected forces, and rapid directional or elevation change. Riders will encounter many unexpected rapid changes in speed, direction, and/or elevation.

ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below.



Accommodates Wheelchair

This symbol is used to identify rides where riders may remain in their wheelchair.



Transferable

This symbol identifies rides that can accommodate Guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



Ambulatory

This symbol identifies rides where Guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

DEFINITIONS

Every ride entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the ride. Valleyfair uses the following terms:



Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



Hand-held Infants: Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a Supervising Companion: Carousel (must ride in chariot), Minnesota River Valley Railroad (must be seated in the center of the bench), Barefoot Beach (non-elevated areas), Breakers Bay (must stay in two feet of water or less), Ripple Rapids (must be in the lap of the Supervising Companion), and Splash Station.



Supervising Companion: Many of our rides have height requirements that allow a Guest under that requirement to ride with a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion is a Companion who is at least 54" in height and approximately 14 years of age, who meets all other criteria for riding, and who will assist their Companion in complying with safe participation instructions. Supervising Companions are responsible for ensuring that the accompanied Rider remains seated properly where applicable and follows all rules and regulations. The Supervising Companion must be seated in the same seat (row) as the Rider who needs accompaniment and can accompany the number of Riders for which the seat is designed. For example, if a seat is designed for three people, the Supervising Companion can accompany two Riders.

HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against five primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride or would like more information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Accessibility Guide or review the Safety Guide and all warning signs posted at each ride entrance and Alternate Access Entrances.

PREGNANCY

Guests who know or believe they may be pregnant should follow all rules, guidelines, and restrictions listed for each ride. Those who are pregnant should not ride a ride that specifically lists pregnancy as a rider restriction. Please closely review all rules and guidelines at the entrance of each ride.

Guests who are pregnant may ride the Carousel, Ferris Wheel, Flying Eagles, Minnesota River Valley Railroad and participate in Barefoot Beach, Breakers Bay, Ripple Rapids, and Splash Station.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. Guests may be “officially” measured at Guest Services or at any ride of the appropriate height level. The measured Guest will be given a wristband to indicate their height range. Wristbands are not required to ride. They are intended to make your wait in line shorter by streamlining the Guest height measurement process.

To accurately measure Guests, a height measuring device may be used during the height measuring process. This device may come into contact with the Guest's head for a brief period.

For the safety of Guests, shoes that contribute excessively to a Guest's height are prohibited during measuring. For example, a Guest is not permitted to wear platform shoes to help meet a height requirement. Valleyfair reserves the right to ask that shoes be removed to ensure that a Guest's height is not being artificially enhanced or manipulated.

In Superior Shores Waterpark, height measurements are taken in bare feet. There is a separate height wristband system for Superior Shores Waterpark.

ATTRACTION ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM

We are proud of our reputation for accommodating Guests with disabilities through our Attraction Accessibility Program. To provide equal access for all Guests, we have developed a program which allows Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairment to access attractions. Information about where Guests access the ride is posted on each attraction's Safety Guide sign. All Guests are required to meet all riding requirements for every attraction, including height and health restrictions in order to safely ride/participate.

The Guests with a mobility restriction or cognitive impairment should visit Guest Services upon their arrival at the park to express their inability to wait in the regular line. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the Guest Services Associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairments who request reasonable accommodations are encouraged to obtain the IBCCES Accessibility Card (IAC) by registering at accessibilitycard.org or via the Accessibility Card mobile app. Once a Guest has filled out the online application and uploaded necessary documentation into a secure online portal, they will be able to access their digital Accessibility Card. Guests will present the IBCCES Accessibility Card to Guest Services upon their arrival at the park to express their accommodation needs. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Note: Only IBCCES can issue the IBCCES Accessibility Card, and not Valleyfair.

CASTS AND BRACES

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from riding rides where the cast or brace will not fit inside the ride unit or where it will present a hazard to the Guest or others. Guests with a cast or brace may be required to sit in a specific seat. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most rides and water slides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed. Casts and braces with exposed metal parts are not permitted on most slides in Superior Shores Waterpark.

The following chart displays the cast and brace rules for all rides and attractions.

- C** Must ride in a chariot
- F** Cast/brace must fit safely in the ride unit
- O** Not permitted to participate on elevated activity area
- Y** May ride with the condition
- Z** Participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary

PROSTHESIS

Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride Charlie Brown's Wind-Up, Power Tower, or Xtreme Swing unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Guests must also be able to maintain proper riding posture. Prosthetic devices with exposed metal parts are prohibited on most attractions. Guests are encouraged to visit Guest Services for assistance before riding to ensure a safe experience.

Guests with prosthetics are advised to consult with the Valleyfair's Supervisory Team for guidance during their visit. Guests with prosthetics enjoying their day at Superior Shores Water park should consult with a member of our Aquatics Supervisory team

For certain rides, manufacturers may require documentation from the prosthetic device's manufacturer confirming it is designed to withstand high-speed roller coaster forces of up to 68 mph and G-forces between 1 to 5 Gs, with sufficient safety measures in place. the prosthetic device to be removed: Breakers Plunge and Steel Venom.

The manufacturers of Delirious and North Star prohibit guests with any prosthetic device from riding.

The manufacturer of Xtreme Swing also prohibits guests with any leg prosthetic devices above the knee from riding.

RIDE DEVICES

For safety reasons, certain attractions may require the removal of medical devices or prosthetics. These devices may interfere with safety restraints, prevent proper riding posture, or pose hazards to the Guest or others.

On rides equipped with removable seats, Guests using wheelchairs may transfer directly to the ride vehicle. Ride attendants and Guest Service staff are available to assist with questions or specific requirements regarding harnesses, mobility aids, or prosthetic devices.

Safety is the park's highest priority. To ensure an enjoyable and safe experience, Guests who do not meet specific rider requirements, including those related to harnesses and mobility aids, may be restricted from participating.

Additional lists are available for :

- Transfer devices, when requested, can be used to assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into a ride unit. The following rides are equipped with a transfer device: Corkscrew, Cosmic Coaster, Excalibur, Northern Lights, Renegade, SNOOPY'S™ Rocket Express, and Wild Thing. Please see an associate at each ride for assistance.
- In addition, specific ride vehicles are equipped with removable sides at Delirious, Flying Eagles, and Northern Lights. These vehicles may further assist Riders in transferring from their wheelchair to the ride unit. Please inform an associate at the ride if you wish to use that vehicle.

For additional guidance, Guests are encouraged to consult the park guide or speak with a Ride Attendant or Guest Relations associate.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Our goal is to make Valleyfair as enjoyable and barrier-free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



Family Services

A space for nursing mothers is available at the Family Care Center. Baby-changing areas and a companion restroom can be found in most restrooms. Please feel free to ask an associate for directions to these locations or review a park map.



First Aid

Our First Aid Building is located before Mad Mouse, behind Cool and Creamy, and is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for Guests with medication is offered at First Aid. In addition, a First Aid Station is located in Superior Shores Waterpark next to Breakers Bay Wavepool. This location is open during Superior Shores Waterpark operating hours.



Hearing Needs

Assistive listening devices are available upon request. These lightweight, wireless devices amplify sounds using signals from transmitters located throughout the park and are recommended for Guests with mild to moderate hearing loss. For more details or to obtain a device, please visit Guest Services.

If you require American Sign Language (ASL) interpreting services, we can provide them with at least seven days advance notice for live show venues. To accompany you for the day. Additionally, show scripts or score sheets can also be requested at each venue. To arrange ASL services, please call the Guest Services Center at **952.445.760**. Alternatively, you can submit your request online through valleyfair.com/contact-us.



Parking

Accessible parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis within the main parking lots of the park. When you arrive at the parking toll booths ask an associate for instructions regarding where to proceed to the accessible parking lot. Both auto and van accessible spaces are provided. A valid disability parking placard or license plate must be displayed at all times while parked in the designated accessible full at the time of your arrival, members of your party may be dropped off at the main pick-up/drop-off area, near the main entrance to the park. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security Officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification. Please ask an associate for directions to additional parking areas.



Quiet Room

Valleyfair offers a Quiet Room located at the Family Care Center, for family members or caregivers to take a break and reduce sensory stimulation. Additionally, there are sensory features provided for guest use.



Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for Guests needing the assistance of a companion are available at the Front Gate, Monster, Breakers Bay Changing Rooms, and Renegade Smokehouse. Wheelchair accessible stalls are located at all restrooms. For your convenience, we also have a family restroom available at our Family Care Center.



Rider Swap

The Rider Swap program allows one adult to stay with non-riders while the rest enjoy the ride. Upon their return, they can switch with the waiting adult, who can ride without joining the regular queue. For more information, visit Guest Services.



Service Animals

Service animals are welcome at Valleyfair. A service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals.

Service animals must be housebroken, controlled with a restraining device, and they must display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. Guests whose service animal demonstrates aggressive and/or inappropriate actions toward a Guest or associate will be directed to remove the animal from the park. There is a limit of two service animals per Guest.

Due to the nature of most rides, service animals must remain with a non-riding member of your party. We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals may be taken on Carousel (Chariot only), Minnesota River Valley Railroad, SNOOPY'S™ Deep Sea Divers, Ferris Wheel, PEANUTS™ Road Rally, and Antique Autos (back row only). Service animals may also accompany a guest when participating in PEANUTS™ Playhouse. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat. They may also attend the performances at Superior Stage, Gazebo Stage, Loon Landing Stage, and PEANUTS Showplace. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools, or lazy rivers. They are permitted to walk through the park areas, including scare zones. Guests may take advantage of our Rider Swap policy for staying with the service animal. Visit Guest Services for more information

A Service Animal Relief Area is located in the grassy area next to Cosmic Coaster. Owners are responsible for disposing of their animal's waste.



Special Dietary Needs

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.



Wheelchairs & Electric Convenience Vehicles

A limited supply of wheelchairs, electric convenience vehicles (ECV), and strollers are available for rent at Stroller and Wheel Chair Rentals. Online reservations are available for wheelchair/ECV rentals in advance of your visit. Reservations can be made by going to valleyfair.com and visit the rentals page under the Tickets tab. Rentals are also available at the park while supplies last.

Wheelchairs, ECV's, and strollers may not be taken out of the park gates or to the parking lot. However, a park associate will be happy to provide any assistance you may need at that time. For any Guest using a personal Segway, please stop by Guest Services prior to entering the park.

GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS AND ECV'S

We require a safe speed be maintained while traveling in the park by Guests who choose to use a wheelchair or ECV. Wheelchairs and ECV's cannot be accommodated on most rides and attractions, with the exception of Minnesota River Valley Railroad, where two wheelchairs can be accommodated. If your wheelchair can be safely accommodated on a ride, you are responsible for it being able to withstand the movement of the ride. Please refer to the individual ride and attraction descriptions in the back of this guide for more specific information. For information on water wheelchairs in the waterpark, please see the Water Wheelchair and Pool Lifts section.

On most rides where Guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, Guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on or near the ride platform or walkway near the ride. Almost every ride is wheelchair accessible. A Wheelchair Lift is available at Corkscrew to transport a Guest in a wheelchair and one companion to our 2nd story ride platform. Please use the doorbell at base of lift to request service. A standard elevator is available for self-service at SNOOPY'S™ Rocket Express. Please ask an associate at each location for assistance. If an ECV has attachments to the vehicle which could impede with the operation of a lift or with safe lift ingress and egress, please transfer to a manual wheelchair. Applicable attachments would include canopies, antennae, umbrellas, awnings, etc. Please ask an associate at each location for assistance.

If in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Guest Services. Valleyfair personnel are not trained in transferring Guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

Guests may re-charge their wheelchair battery at Stroller and Wheelchair Rental.

EVACUATIONS

Evacuations may be required due to mechanical reasons, weather conditions, or a power interruption. If an evacuation is required, Riders may need to maneuver across catwalks, from the highest point of the ride, and down steeply inclined catwalks or steps. Ride units may also stop at the top of a lift or on the ride course. Certain evacuations may require Riders to use additional safety equipment during the process. Remain seated until given instructions. In Superior Shores Waterpark Guests may be asked to evacuate pools as quickly as possible using stairs or ladders. If an evacuation from a ride/attraction is required, Riders requiring assistance during the ride evacuation may be escorted last in order to expedite the ride evacuation process. If so, you accept any risk due to delayed evacuation if we need to physically lift or lower you.

GUESTS OF LARGER SIZE

All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts must be positioned and fastened properly to allow Guests to ride. Due to restraint system requirements, Guests of larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our rides. Our larger Guests may experience difficulty on: Charlie Brown's Wind-Up, Corkscrew, Delirious, Excalibu

High Roller, Kite Eating Tree, Linus Launcher, Monster, Northern Lights, PEANUTS™ 500, Power Tower, Renegade, Steel Venom, SuperCat, Tilter, The Wave, Wheel of Fortune, Wild Thing, and Xtreme Swing.

Maximum and minimum weight limits can be found under the individual rides in this guide and on the Rider Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to rides with restrictions.

If you are concerned about whether or not you can be accommodated safely on a ride, you may enter the ride via the exit to ensure the restraints function properly prior to waiting in line. The rest of your party may wait for you outside the exit.

Test seats are located at the ride entrance(s) of: Steel Venom and Xtreme Swing.

The manufacturer requires a maximum Guest height on the following rides: Sally's Swing Set 73", and Steel Venom 78".

LOOSE ARTICLES

Most rides cannot accommodate loose articles including jewelry, cell phones, hats, cameras, purses, backpacks, basketballs, umbrellas, beverage containers, electronic devices, etc. Items must be safely secured in cargo pockets, a waist pack, in a bin on the ride platform, in a locker, or with a non-Rider. Valleyfair is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

Extra or bulky clothing, backpacks, and anything else that could potentially be between the Rider and the restraint will not be allowed. The restraint mechanism must be secured snugly against the Rider's body. Using cell phones or other electronic devices for any purpose, including picture taking, is prohibited on most rides. Failure to comply may result in ejection from the park.

Glasses must be secured on all rides. On Delirious, Power Tower, Xtreme Swing, and designated waterpark attractions, glasses must be secured by an athletic strap or they cannot be worn on the ride.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water at water rides and attractions. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all rides. Sensory headphones or helmets may be accommodated on select rides. Please see an associate for more details.

Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to a person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

LOST & FOUND

All items found at Valleyfair are turned in to Guest Services. If you lose an item on a ride, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the ride in operation, an immediate search may not be possible.

Lost articles may be reported via the internet at valleyfair.com/lost-and-found.

For your safety, do not enter unauthorized areas to retrieve lost articles. You can be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

MAGNETIC FIELDS ON RIDES

Magnetics are used at the following attractions: Steel Venom and Renegade. Guests with medical devices sensitive to magnetic fields (pacemakers, hearing aids, etc.) should consider these factors when deciding to ride.

OXYGEN TANKS

Due to the dynamic nature of rides, portable oxygen tanks are only permitted on the following rides: Carousel and Minnesota River Valley Railroad. The tank must fit safely in the ride unit and not interfere with the ride restraint system. For your convenience, the park's First Aid station will be able to appropriately store your additional oxygen tanks during your visit.

Many rides can accommodate smaller personal oxygen equipment. Personal oxygen equipment that can be secured around the waist, or with a strap that can be worn over the shoulder of one arm and under the other arm, may be permitted as long as the contents of the equipment housing can be contained. The equipment must allow the ride restraint System to be secured snugly against the Rider's body. The equipment must not prevent Riders from properly sitting in the ride unit with their back and shoulders against the seat back. At no time may the equipment be between the Rider and the seat or the restraint. Riders must be free to hold on during the ride; therefore, nothing may be in their hands while riding.

STROBE LIGHTING & SPECIAL EFFECTS

Many attractions utilize special effects, including but not limited to: haze and other atmospheric effects, scents, areas of low lighting, loud music, sound effects, strobe lighting and other specialty lighting. Guests with medical conditions that may be impacted by these special effects are advised not to participate in these attractions. Attractions utilizing these effects include: Renegade and Wild Thing.

PROPER ATTIRE

For the safety and enjoyment of our guests, everyone is to adhere to proper dress attire, as most rides require each Guest ride with shirts, shorts, and shoes. Loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be fully secured or removed to prevent any interference with the ride restraint system. Scarves must be removed on the following rides, Steel Venom, Wild Thing, Power Tower, and Ripcord. Scarves must be tucked in and secured on Bumper Cars, Charlie Brown's WindUp, Corkscrew, Cosmic Coaster, Excalibur, High Roller, Linus Beetle Bugs, Linus Launcher, Mad Mouse, Monster, North Star, Northern Lights, PEANUTS™ 500, Renegade, Sally's Swingset, Scrambler, SuperCat, The Wave, Thunder Canyon, Wheel of Fortune, Delirious, and Xtreme Swing. Loose-fitting shoes must be removed before riding Charlie Brown's Wind-Up, Kite Eating Tree, Linus Launcher, North Star, Power Tower, Steel Venom, and Xtreme Swing.

Swimwear is not permitted on rides outside of Superior Shores Waterpark the exception of The Wave and Thunder Canyon. Swimwear is required to be appropriate. Thongs or transparent clothing are not permitted.

Additionally, jewelry, such as necklaces, bracelets, dangling earrings, and rings (except wedding bands) are prohibited on Superior Plunge and Great Lake Launchers

RIDER CRITERIA

Our Attraction Accessibility Program is designed to allow Guests to participate in the enjoyment of our attractions as much as possible. The program was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely ride each attraction. It is our policy to allow anyone to ride who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to themselves or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Attraction Accessibility Program as necessary.

The evaluation of each attraction considered the following criteria:

Independent seated postural control.

The Guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as carousel horses require the ability to form a saddle posture with the Guest's thighs.

Appropriate center of gravity.

The Guest's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.

Guests must have one functioning arm that exhibits good grip control, the ability to brace, and is strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.

Guests must have two functioning arms that exhibit good grip control, the ability to brace, and are strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.

Guests must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.

Guests must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics

Minimum of two functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of three functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and one arm or two arms and one leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of four functioning extremities.

Guests must have four functioning extremities (two legs and two arms) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Ability to enter/exit the attraction within specified parameters without endangering self or others.

Guests must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our associates and Guests, associates are instructed not to perform any lifting of Guests.

Appropriate observed behavior.

Guest demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow Guest requirements. Appropriate observed behavior may include, but not be limited to maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride safety equipment, and willingness to participate.

Guests have a duty to:

- Exercise good judgment
- Act in a responsible manner while using amusement rides
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs

RIDES

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the type of actions caused by various rides. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria itemized above. **In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the ride safely.** Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each ride.

Charlie Brown's Wind-Up 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 340 lb. per sweep

A chair swing family ride with free hanging seats suspended from an elevated, rotating, and slanting tower. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and a between-the-leg safety belt secures each rider. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. An additional individual seatbelt is positioned across the chest and under the arms of each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Corkscrew 5



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed, looping roller coaster which turns Riders upside down three times. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg remnants sufficient to brace self upright in the seat. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A wheelchair lift is available to transport guests from the entrance to the ride platform. Please use the doorbell at the base of the lift to request assistance. Limit one rider in wheelchair and one companion in lift at a time.

Cosmic Coaster 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride **alone or accompanied** by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

A self-propelled roller coaster that follows a twisted pattern.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Delirious 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

This ride has a compact roller coaster train on a circular track that is positioned vertically. The ride moves in a pendulum style resulting in up to 10 upside down loops.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have two functioning arms and two functioning legs. Two functioning arms are sufficient if the guest has a normal center of gravity and the lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Prosthetics are not permitted on the ride. To facilitate boarding, a row with a larger opening is available upon request. Please inform an associate if you wish to use that row.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Note: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands of Riders while riding.

Excalibur 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed wood and steel coaster with a combination of high speed banked turns, airtime humps, and rapid directional changes.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit.

Ferris Wheel 2



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants **or** single Riders are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 1,050 lb. per gondola

A Ferris wheel ride where guests ride in gondolas suspended from the outer rim of the wheel. Riders will experience changes in direction and elevation.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests who do not have independent seated postural control or demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Service animals are permitted to ride this attraction.

Flying Ace Balloon Race 2



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Hot air balloon ride that spins and raises Riders in the air.

Restraint System: A shared seat belt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Flying Eagles 3



Guests must be 44" tall to ride alone **or** 36" **and** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 340 lb. per car

Riders ride in suspended cars that rotate in a circle. Once the ride's speed increases, Riders use a fin on the front of the car to steer the car higher or lower.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (including prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride. Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. To facilitate boarding, a car with a larger opening is available upon request. Please inform an associate if you wish to use that car.

High Roller 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A traditional out-and-back wooden rollercoaster with airtime humps.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Kite Eating Tree 2



Guests must be 36" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 700 lb. per ride; this ride only accommodates one adult per ride

This children's ride hoists Riders up in the air and provides a gentle yet bouncy trip down.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all Riders in the row. An individual seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm that includes a hand and two functioning legs. Guests may ride with one leg amputation; amputation must be below the knee. Guests with the leg amputation must be at least 42" tall to ride or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any prosthesis must consult with Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Linus' Beetle Bugs 1



Guests must be under 54" tall to ride. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This is a slow moving themed children's circular ride with an undulating platform.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

Linus Launcher 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone **or** 36" tall **and** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 275 lb. per gondola; this ride only accommodates one adult per vehicle.

A circular ride where riders experience the sensation of flying in an elevated, slanted and prone position. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: A cage secures each rider over the back. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Lucy's Tugboat 2



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted. This ride only accommodates two adults per row.

This spinning tugboat ride which travels back and forth over an upward curved track.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row above their laps. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Mad Mouse 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone **or** 42" tall **and** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A steel roller coaster with airtime hills and hairpin turns. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction, moments of weightlessness, and rapid movements from side to side.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available through the Fast Lane gate to the left of the entrance. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Minnesota River Valley Railroad 1



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 42" tall must sit in the center of the bench.

Riders board an antique train ride that offers a round trip through the park with stops at two stations (at the front of the park and in PLANET SNOOPY™).

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, and hand-held infants must ride in the center of the bench with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access for both stations is through the ride entrance. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. Services animals are permitted to ride this attraction.

Monster 3



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 400 lb. per car

This is a circular ride with six sweeps of gondolas moving clockwise versus the up-and-down, counter-clockwise rotation of the arms. Riders will experience changes in speed, direction, and elevation, and rapid movements from side to side.

Restraint System: An enclosed ride unit encapsulates the ride unit to secure the Riders. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

North Star 4



Guests must be 44" tall to ride.

A chair swing thrill ride with free hanging seats suspended from an elevated and rotating gondola. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the gondola ascends and descends the tower.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider. An additional individual seatbelt is positioned across the chest and under the arms of each rider. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of four functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient if the guest has a normal center of gravity and the lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, and braced arm cast are not permitted to ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Prosthetics are not permitted on the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Northern Lights 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone **or** 42" tall **and** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A family thrill ride where a 36-passenger gondola spins as it travels on a track. Riders will experience weightlessness, rapid movements from side to side, and rapidly changing forces and directions.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row. A door further encloses the ride unit. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the Guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. To facilitate boarding, a row with a larger opening is available upon request. Please inform an associate if you wish to use that row.

Renegade 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed wooden roller coaster with high speed airtime humps, quick turns, and enclosed tunnels.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (excluding prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting and utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Sally's Swing Set 2



Guests must be between 36" **and** 73" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 1,540 lb. per ride; this ride only accommodates two adults per row

A large swing ride designed for children that produces a feeling of weightlessness.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all riders in the row. A between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Scrambler 3



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone **or** 36" tall **and** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 510 lb. per car

Rotating cars are mounted on counter-rotating arms, which produces strong accelerations and side to side movement, changing force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

SNOOPY™ vs. Red Baron 2



Guests must be between 36" **and** 54" tall to ride.

A slow-moving plane ride that goes up and down as the ride rotates around in a circle. Riders can use a joystick to control the elevation of their unit.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

SuperCat 2



Guests must be 52" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This is a circular ride that follows an undulating course.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests may have two functioning legs instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

The Wave 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 3,400 lb. per boat

Water flume ride with 20-passenger boats. You will get wet.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available through the walkway directly to the left of the entrance through the Fast Lane entrance. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Watch your step, as the ride unit and ride exit may be slippery and wet.

Note: This ride may close if the temperature is below 65°F.

WARNING: Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

Thunder Canyon 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride.

A family water ride where riders travel in rafts along a man-made river full of rapids, geysers, canyons, and waterfalls. Rafts float and bounce down high-speed rapids, often rotating rapidly after impacting with the bank of the river. Riders will get wet.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

Note: This ride may close if the temperature is below 65°F.

WARNING: Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

Tilter



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 800 lb. per car

This is a circular ride where cars pivot by centrifugal force created by the ride's rotating table.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Wheel of Fortune



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 340 lb. per seat

This is a circular ride that rises to a tilted position while rotating backward producing changes of force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. Single Riders who do not take up over half the seat must be paired with another rider. The smaller rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Wild Thing



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

An out-and-back hyper steel roller coaster with banked curves and airtime hills. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction, weightlessness, and rapid movements from side to side.






Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Each attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides 	This is a low speed, and or shallow water attraction.
Mild Thrill Rides 	This is a low to medium speed attraction, and/or water depth to 48 inches. Some rider control, maneuvering and/or swimming skills required.
Moderate Thrill Rides 	This is a medium speed attraction. Height and water depth may vary Moderate or unexpected forces can be generated during the ride. This attraction may require rider control and/or strong swimming skills. Physical activity may be strenuous.
High Thrill Rides 	This is a fast paced ride experience. Riders will encounter changes in speed, direction, elevation, strong water currents, and/or depth of water, some of which is unexpected. This attraction requires rider body control and strong swimming skills.
Aggressive Thrill Rides 	This is a high speed and/or deep water attraction with turbulent turns, drops and/or strong water currents with changes in speed, direction, elevation and/or deep water, which may be unexpected. This attraction requires rider body control and swimming skills.

Scales

Some attractions require weight verification to participate on. For these attractions, all riders must step on to a scale and verify weight prior to participating. Some attractions may have a combined weight capacity. All participants must meet the individual weight restriction as well as the combined weight restriction to participate. Scales are used at Coho Curl, Pike Plunge, Surgin' Sturgeon, Wild Walleye.



Appropriate Attire

Appropriate swimwear is required to participate in all attractions. Thongs and transparent clothing/swimwear are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swimwear. Guests wearing bathing attire with metal buttons, rivets, zippers, or snaps will not be permitted participate in any of our attractions. Jewelry including but not limited to, necklaces, bracelets, dangling earrings, and rings other than wedding bands are prohibited on Great Lake Launchers and Superior Plunge. For your safety, loose clothing (including scarves and other freeflowing clothing) must be significantly secured or removed and placed in a waist pack, in a locker, or with a nonparticipant to prevent any interference with the ride experience. Hearing devices or other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take the necessary steps to protect such items. Contact lenses are not recommended. Guests requiring special accommodation should speak to a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team.



Life Jackets

Life jackets are available for all Guests. Only U.S. Coast Guard (or Canada) approved life jackets are allowed as floatation devices. Life jackets are provided free of charge for Guests who require one.

In wave pools, life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by Supervising Companions. This policy will be enforced at Breakers Bay Wave Pool

In other attractions requiring life jackets, children who are less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers must wear a life jacket. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by Supervising Companions. This policy will be enforced at Ripple Rapids.



Ongoing Lifeguard Training

In an ongoing effort to provide a safe and enjoyable waterpark experience for our Guests, Superior Shores Waterpark routinely utilizes training exercises to improve our lifeguards' skills and vigilance. These exercises will occur during normal operating hours and may consist of the following: submersible water manikins, the use of video surveillance equipment, internal and external audits, and responsive/unresponsive water rescues and/or first aid scenarios.



Swim Diapers

Diaper dependent Guests are required to wear swim diapers or a diaper specifically designed for aquatic use while participating in Superior Shores Waterpark attractions. Swim diapers are available for purchase at Dockside and Cabanas.



Water Wheelchairs and Pool Lifts

A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance when gaining access into Barefoot Beach and Minnow Bay (ground level only), Breakers Bay Wave Pool, and Splash Station. The water wheelchair may be used by multiple Guests on the same day. While in the wave pool, the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. Guests participating in a wave pool are permitted to use a personal wheelchair. Personal wheelchairs are permitted up to the seat's water depth. Guests utilizing wheelchairs will not be required to utilize a life jacket while in the wave pool only if their height exceeds 52" and meet all other rider criteria for the attraction. Guests may choose to use a water wheelchair instead of a personal wheelchair. While using either a personal wheelchair or a water wheelchair, Guests must not utilize the wheelchair's seatbelts while in the wave pool.

Motorized or electric personal wheelchairs will be permitted at Barefoot Beach. Walkers, canes, or other assistive devices are permitted only at ankle depth in the following attractions Barefoot Beach, Breakers Bay, Minnow Bay, and Splash Station. A pool lift is available at Ripple Rapids.

During your visit, please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory team to obtain access to the water wheelchair or pool lift and for further accessibility information.

WATERPARK ATTRACTIONS

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the type of actions caused by various attractions. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria outlined on pages 19 to 21.

In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have independent seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely

Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each attraction. Please use caution when entering and exiting waterpark attractions as the surrounding areas may be slippery. Conveying devices, such as tubes and rafts, may be slippery and can shift during loading and unloading.

Barefoot Beach 1



A zero-depth interactive playground.

Rider Criteria: Guests unable to maintain seated postural control, who do not have the ability to safely enter and exit the attraction, or who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible.

Barefoot Beach Slides 1



Children must be less than 54" tall in bare feet to ride.

Small slides for children.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have the ability to safely enter and exit the attraction, or who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities. Hand-held infants may not ride slides. Guests with full arm casts, braced arm casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collar bones are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Breakers Bay 4



In wave pools, life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet and for participants who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Life jackets are available for all Guests. Guests who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

A large wave pool with depths ranging from 0 ft. to 6 ft. Waves are generated for five minutes on, and then five minutes off. During wave action, strenuous activity is required. Prolonged exposure to wave action may result in fatigue. Exercise caution in deep water.

Ripple Rapids 2



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

A slow-moving, winding river tube ride at a water depth of 30".

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests who cannot enter/exit without endangering self must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the stairs or pool lift. Guests will have to transfer to the stairs, lift, or tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory team to obtain access to the pool lift.

Coho Curl 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.
Maximum Weight - 300 lb. per rider
400 lb. per tube

Cruise through curved turns on Coho Curl. (Water Depth 12")

Rider Criteria: Riders must be seated, facing forward, knees bent and hands gripping handles. Guests must have a minimum of 3 functioning extremities; including two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Cervical collar, neck, brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, leg cast, or foot casts are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted. Eyewear must be secured with a strap. No swimwear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentation.

Pike Plunge 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.
Maximum Weight - 300 lb.

Pike Plunge is a duel-mat racer slide for those looking to test their speed against a partner! Get ready, get set, then plunge down your lane at a pulse-pounding pace—no matter who reaches the finish line first, you'll both be drenched and raring to race again and again. (Water Depth 12")

Rider Criteria: Riders will be laying head first and face down. Riders must maintain a firm grip on both handles and have elbows resting on the mat at all times. Guests must have a minimum of 3 functioning extremities; including two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Cervical collar, neck, brace, broken collar bone, arm cast including or above the elbow, leg cast, foot cast, or brace, or brace between legs are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted. Eyewear must be secured with a strap. No swimwear with

Surgin' Sturgeon 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.
Maximum Weight - 300 lb. per rider
400 lb. per tube

Splash down the spiraling Surgin' Sturgeon. (Water Depth 12")

Rider Criteria: Riders must be seated, facing forward, knees bent and hands gripping handles. Guests must have a minimum of 3 functioning extremities; including two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Cervical collar, neck, brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, leg cast, or foot casts are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted. Eyewear must be secured with a strap. No swimwear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentation.

Wild Walleye 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.
Maximum Weight - 300 lb. per rider
400 lb. per tube

Whip around whirling corners on Wild Walleye. (Fill in depth here)

Rider Criteria: Riders must be seated, facing forward, knees bent and hands gripping handles. Guests must have a minimum of 3 functioning extremities; including two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Cervical collar, neck, brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, leg cast, or foot casts are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted. Eyewear must be secured with a strap. No swimwear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentation.

Splash Station 1



An interactive pool for children which features slides, water cannons, and other play elements.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible.

Minnow Bay- Slides 1



*Guests must be 36" tall in bare feet to ride.
Maximum Weight - 200 lb. per rider*

This family lagoon features eight kid-friendly slides and shallow, splashy waters—perfect for young adventurers!

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position feet first, in a sitting position or laying on their back (sit up to go slower, lie down to go faster) Guests must have a minimum of 1 functioning arm. Cervical collar, neck, brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, leg cast, or foot casts are not permitted.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several stairs. Guests will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted. Eyewear must be secured with a strap. No swimwear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentation.

Minnow Bay- Slides 1



A zero-depth entry children's pool. Maximum water depth is 24" deep.

Rider Criteria: Guests without seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-Held Infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible. A water wheelchair is available for Guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory Team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted.

ENTERTAINMENT VENUES

Due to the popularity of our shows, we suggest you arrive early as seating may be limited. Show schedules are available at Guest Services, on the Valleyfair mobile app, and at any theater entrance. All entertainment venues are accessible to Guests who may have a mobility impairment. Assisted listening devices are available for Guests at each theater, who are hearing impaired. Large-print scripts may also be available. Ask any associate at the venue for assistance.

Superior Stage

Superior Stage is an outdoor show venue featuring singing and dancing shows and live bands. The viewing area consists of bench seating and standing areas and is located near Corkscrew.

Gazebo Stage

Gazebo Stage is a small stage area featuring small group acts during special events such as Corn Fest and Tricks and Treats. This location has table seating around a central plaza located across from Coaster's Restaurant.

Loon Landing Stage

Located in Soak City, this venue hosts the Drifters, our acoustic duo. This location has bench seating

PEANUTS™ Showplace

PEANUTS™ Showplace is located in Planet Snoopy® and is the primary location for our PEANUTS™ characters. This location has stadium-style bench seating with ramps and wheelchair seating available.

VALLEYS CARE®

Valleyscare at Valleyfair has extreme attractions that are designed to scare and startle.
